A FEW KEY ELEMENTS TO BE AWARE OF:



Unless otherwise agreed upon in writing, the design process will be as follows. The artist will provide a sketch prior to starting the project. The first version will be provided after initial consultation, and the second version will incorporate any feedback shared on initial design. Additional sketches/discussion meetings will be billed accordingly.



If applicable, it is the venue's responsibility to install the finished project.



Once the project has been finalized, **it is the venue's responsibility to do a final inspection of the piece**. From that point on, all upkeep and maintenance become the responsibility of the venue. To ensure the durability of the artwork, please follow the artist's recommendations for maintenance.



The artist is aware that, upon creation, all rights, titles and interests in and to any intellectual property rights, including without limitation **100% of all copyrights have been designated to your venue.**



If your public art piece becomes damaged, MASC will see if the original artist is available to make any repairs and provide you with a quote.

Thank you again for having chosen to work with a MASC artist to create an art piece for your venue! We are sure that its beauty, meaning and creativity will be a wonderful addition to your space for many years to come.
